MAINTENANCE

- 1. Periodically check the tightness of the recoil guide rod and sight rib screws. Rib screws apply to Target model only. When tightening the rib screws, alternately tighten each screw twice to draw the rib down evenly. A slight amount of blue (242) Loctite, or similar product, needs to be used if the recoil rod or rib screws become loose. DO NOT use red or green Loctite. These are permanent and you may not be able to easily disassemble the unit.
- 2. Keep the breach area and chamber clean.
- 3. Use a small amount of oil on the slide rails.
- 4. DO NOT REMOVE THE STEEL BREECH FROM THE ALUMINUM SLIDE.

DISASSEMBLY FOR CLEANING

- 1. All components of your conversion kit and firearm should be cleaned thoroughly after each use.
- 2. Remove the magazine and unload the weapon. Visually inspect the chamber to make sure it is empty.
- 3. Remove the conversion unit from the frame.
- 4. Unscrew the Recoil Rod completely out of the barrel lug.
- 5. Remove the recoil rod and spring from the assembly.
- 6. Remove the barrel from the slide.

INTRODUCTION

The "Advantage Arms, Inc." conversion kit was designed to shoot inexpensive, HIGH VELOCITY, .22 Long Rifle ammunition. It is a blow-back operated system for use on a variety of 1911 pistols. Each kit was tested for fit and function before shipping.

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Point the firearm in a safe direction. Remove the magazine and clear the firearm of ammunition. REMOVING THE MAGAZINE ALONE DOES NOT UNLOAD THE FIREARM. VISUALLY INSPECT THE CHAMBER TO MAKE SURE THAT IT IS EMPTY.
- 2. Disassemble the firearm
- 3. Slide the Advantage Arms Conversion Unit onto the frame.
- 4. Install the Advantage Arms slide stop into the frame insuring the barrel has been captured by the slide stop.
- Pull the slide to the rear about 1/2" to expose the front of the recoil guide rod. DO NOT LOCK THE SLIDE BACK DURING INSTALLATION.
- 6. Using the Take-Down Tool (provided with each kit), screw the recoil guide rod in firmly against the slide stop. This locks the barrel down onto the frame.
- 7. Move the slide back and forth, checking that it moves freely and closes easily.
- 8. Make sure that the slide stop is fully inserted and moves freely. If the slide stop is not fully installed, the slide may not lock back on the last round.

OPERATION

- The conversion kit was designed to use 40 grain, HIGH VELOCITY, .22 Long Rifle ammunition. The unit was successfully tested using a variety of brands. DO NOT use Federal or PMC ammunition.
- 2. After loading the "Advantage Arms" magazine (10 rounds) insert it into the firearm just as you would your 1911 magazine.
- 3. Point the gun in a safe direction, pull the slide as far reward as possible, release the slide and allow it to slam shut while continuing to keep the gun pointed in a safe direction. DO NOT ease the slide closed by holding it, this will cause a slow feed situation and could cause the firearm to jam.

Helpful Hint: The slide is easier to pull back if you cock the hammer first!

- 4. The firearm is now ready to shoot. The slide will remain open after the last round has been fired.
- 5. When unloading your unit, or when you are finished shooting, visually check the chamber to make sure it is EMPTY.
- 6. Dry firing can be done, however, it is not recommended.

REMOVING THE CONVERSION SLIDE

- 1. Point the firearm in a safe direction. Remove the magazine and clear the firearm of ammunition. REMOVING THE MAGAZINE ALONE DOES NOT UNLOAD THE FIREARM. VISUALLY INSECT THE CHAMBER TO MAKE SURE THAT IT'S EMPTY.
- 2. The magazine must be removed before attempting to remove the Advantage Arms slide from the firearm.
- 3. Move the slide to the rear about 1/2" to expose the front of the recoil guide rod.
- 4. Using the Take-Down Tool provided, loosen the recoil guide rod (One full turn should be sufficient).
- 5. Remove the tool from the recoil guide rod and let the slide return forward.
- 6. You can now remove the slide stop and remove the Advantage Arms .22 slide from the firearm.
